Inaccurate article on MOH's conclusion on higher insurance claims

On 25 March 2018, a newspaper article by Ms Salma Khalik alleged that "the [Ministry of Health] MOH concluded that much of the higher claims was the result of overcharging and overtreatment by doctors in the private sector."

SMA immediately wrote to MOH to seek confirmation and clarification on the allegations relating to higher claims from policyholders with Integrated Shield Plans and full riders. MOH subsequently clarified in an official reply that "MOH has never drawn such a conclusion or made statements alluding to this view."

During this period, several SMA Council Members also met with a group of concerned SMA Members regarding the allegations. The false statement was subsequently clarified as incorrect by *The Straits Times* on 30 March 2018 in the "What It Should Have Been" section.

SMA will continue to be vigilant for fake news and advocate for both patients and members.
