## IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT FROM ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The Alumni Association would like to remind SMA members that they may only park their vehicles in the Alumni Medical Centre carpark *if they are attending to errands and official matters at the SMA Secretariat, or attending talks/seminars within the premises.* 

In addition, SMA members are required to display the SMA car decal as an identification of membership (SMA members can purchase the decals from the SMA Secretariat at \$2 each). All visitors to the Alumni Medical Centre should also sign in at the Alumni Association's reception counter at Level I after parking their vehicles; a registration log has been put in place to record visitation details. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Please note that to keep in check unauthorised parking of vehicles by people who are in the vicinity, the Alumni Association has implemented vehicle wheel-clamping at the carpark since I June 2006. *The wheel-clamp release fee is \$200*.
