Congratulations, Dr Abdul Razakjr Omar!

Dr Razakjr has been named the Berita Harian Achiever of the Year 2013 for his notable achievements in the medical sector, as well as for being a role model for the Malay community in Singapore. The annual award, organised by Singapore Press Holdings' Malay daily newspaper, *Berita Harian*, honours Malay/Muslim individuals who have achieved notable success in their chosen fields, or possess qualities like determination and the ability to overcome odds.

Dr Razakjr, the first Malay heart specialist in Singapore, is currently a consultant cardiologist at Raffles Heart Centre. He previously served as visiting consultant to National University Heart Centre, Khoo Teck Puat Hospital and Jurong General Hospital at various times from 2010 to 2013, and was an adjunct assistant professor at Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, National University of Singapore (NUS). Dr Razakjr also serves as an SMA Council Member and chairs various SMA committees, including the Complaints Committee and Private Practice Committee.

Prof Wong has been selected for the prestigious Eisenhower Fellowship to the US, which will be held from September to November this year. During the fellowship, he will meet with senior healthcare leaders, academics and professionals with a focus on the future challenges of healthcare, the interaction between scientific research and medical practice, and the interface between Medicine, science, and the healthcare industry.

Prof Wong is currently a senior consultant ophthalmologist at Singapore National Eye Centre and National University Hospital; Executive Director of Singapore Eye Research Institute; professor and Head of the Department of Ophthalmology at NUS; and Group Director of Research with SingHealth. Besides being a renowned clinician-scientist, Prof Wong is also SMA's 2nd Vice President and chairs various SMA committees, including the Social Concerns Committee and the recently established SMA Charity Fund. **SMA**
