Dr Tony Tan Keng Yam, President of the Republic of Singapore, who graced the occasion, was conferred the SMA Honorary Membership. Herein, we reproduce the citation for President Tony Tan, delivered by Dr Wong Tien Hua, President of the 56th SMA Council, and report the highlights of that evening of collegiality.

From the dinner, the key message for this year was the rebranding of SMA – our traditional motto of "Service before Self" has been reinterpreted as "For Doctors, For Patients". There was also an emphasis on the ageing population with multiple medical problems, requiring central coordination, thus highlighting the important role of the family physician.

This June, we also commemorate the 15th anniversary of the SMA Centre for Medical Ethics & Professionalism (CMEP) with a series of articles devoted to the centre and updates on professionalism in medicine. In this month's President's Forum, Dr Wong Tien Hua describes a simple working model for the intricate interactions of professionalism, ethics, knowledge and trust. Accompanying his article is a humorous cartoon by Dr Kevin Loy, a GP in private practice with a keen interest in art.
